A bug that comes behind bees and says boo!

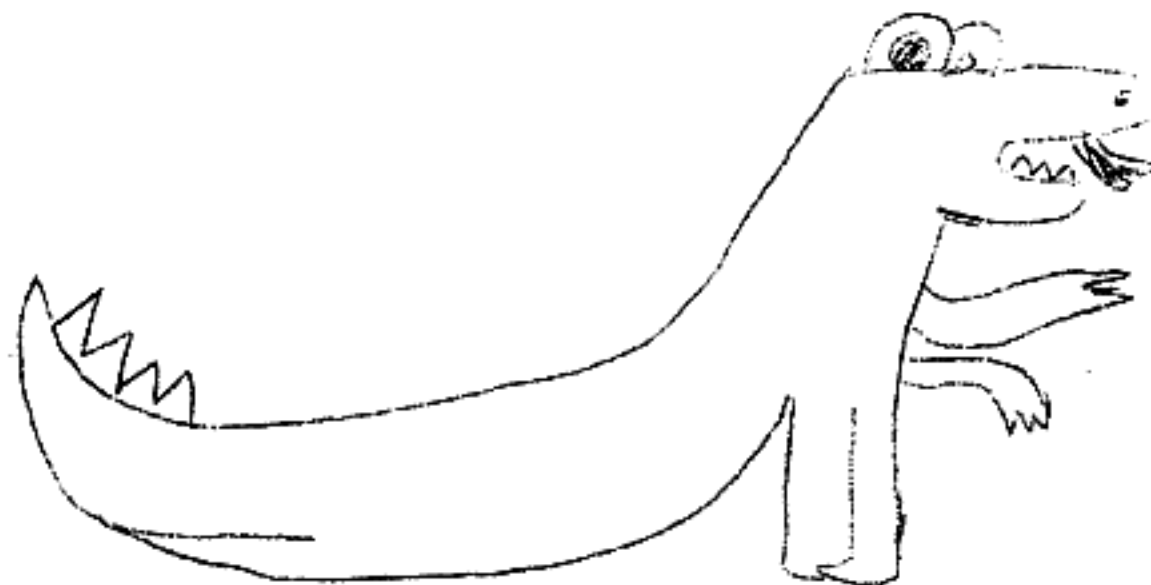

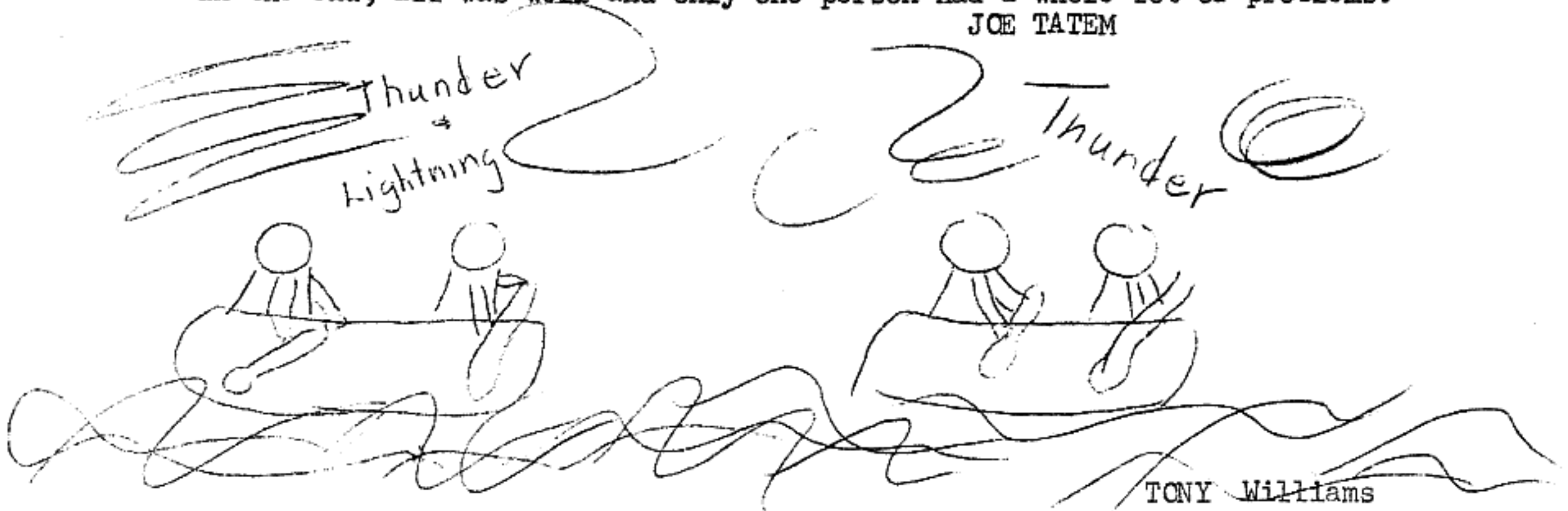
B-1 Breaks Camp Chanco Record
